Introducing Ezra

Reflection Our daily bible readings this week bring us into the book of Ezra. This, and the companion book of Nehemiah are set in the early stages of Jewish return to Jerusalem after the Babylonian exile. Ezra was a priest who had responsibility for helping the returned exiles to rebuild their lives as faithful followers of the God of Israel. He taught them the importance of keeping the law, and of observing the Jewish festivals, while encouraging them to trust God as they went about the difficult work of rebuilding Jerusalem. $J\mathcal{U}$.
